For Parents and Children.

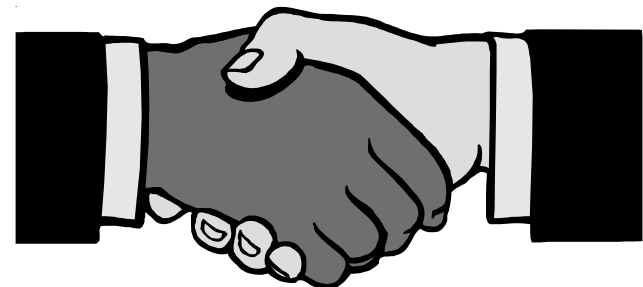

Ethics for Prevention Professionals

For Adults.

This 6-hour ethics training examines the Code of Ethics for Prevention in Ohio as well as professional vs. unprofessional conduct. Participants will gain a more useful and practical understanding of ethics through case studies and discussion.

Cost: \$65/person (10 person minimum)

Northeast Ohio Prevention Leadership Institute

Ohio Certified Prevention Specialist Candidates.

Drugs Don't Work in the Mahoning Valley

For Adults.

Drugs Don't Work in the Mahoning Valley, a project of the Neil Kennedy Recovery Clinic, can provide help with employee education and supervisor training. In consortium with Meridian Services, Inc. also provides policy consultation, employee assistance and alcohol/drug testing.

Second Step for Families

For Parents.

Developed by the Committee for Children, Second Step: A Violence Prevention Curriculum is an exemplary Safe Disciplined and Drug-Free School program as listed by the US Department of Education expert panel. This program is a 6 session interactive workshop focusing on the development of empathy, impulse control and problem solving.

Cost: \$80/session or \$480 per series

In School Second Step

For children, grades K-8

Heralded by the U.S. Department of Education as an "Exemplary Program", the *Second Step* violence prevention curriculum is designed to focus on the social-emotional learning needs of K-8th grade students. Utilizing role-play techniques, videos, and homework, *Second Step* teaches students effective communication, problem-solving strategies and skills in three key areas: **Empathy, Impulse Control, and Anger Management.**

Cost: \$80 per session (5 sessions minimum)

Project Alert

For Middle Grades

Project Alert, developed and tested by RAND, has been proven effective in helping young people identify and resist pressures that lead to experimentation with drugs and preventing experimenters from becoming regular users. Project Alert is a 14-session (11 lessons/3 booster sessions) drug prevention curriculum for middle grade students.

Cost: \$1,120 per series

Too Good For Drugs

For Elementary/Middle Grades

Developed by the Mendez Foundation, this SAMHSA model program is a multi-faceted, interactive social influence intervention using a universal education strategy. The *Too Good For Drugs* curriculum focuses on developing personal and interpersonal skills to resist internal and external pressures to use drugs. The program consists of 10 sessions.

Cost: \$800 per series or \$80/session (five session minimum)

Too Good For Drugs Afterschool Activities

For Elementary/Middle Grades

Too Good for Drugs & Violence – After-School Activities (ages 5–13) is a dynamic program that includes activities adapted from “**Too Good for Drugs.**” and “**Too Good for Violence.**” Designed for recreation centers, community or after-school settings, these activities augment school-based prevention programs with fun and engaging opportunities to learn and practice prevention skills.

Cost: \$800 per series or \$80/session (five session minimum)

Support Group Facilitation

K-6th grade “Children at Promise.”

8 sessions for children or adolescents who experience barriers to academic achievement, such as chemically addictive families, family illness, death or divorce.

Cost: \$640 per series or \$80/session (five session minimum)

Trauma Intervention Program (SITCAP)

Structured Sensory Intervention for Traumatized Children, Adolescents and Parents

8 Individual or group sessions that help improve grades and behavior in children exposed to traumatic incidents, ie: sexual/physical assault, domestic violence, house fires, terminal illness, divorce/adoption and separation from parents.

I Feel Better Now - Ages 6-12

Trauma Intervention for Children and Adolescents - Ages 6-12 and 13-18

Parents in Trauma: Learning to Survive

Cost: \$640 per series or \$80/session (five session minimum)

BABES

Elementary Puppet Curriculum.

Seven weekly lessons for primary children on life skills, self image, decision making, coping skills, alcohol and other drug information, asking for help and review lessons.

"Honk, Honk," says Early Bird, "BABES is fun!"

Cost: \$560 per series

Woman to Woman

For the lifespan.

Woman to Woman is a program designed to educate women of childbearing age on the dangerous effects of Alcohol, Tobacco or Other Drug use and violence during pregnancy. Woman to Woman provides education for preschool aged children through adulthood regarding Alcohol, Tobacco or Other Drug use, providing tools to aid in self esteem, decision making, problem solving and team building.

Girl Power

For Girls Only.

Girl Power events may include small groups for team building and processing, activities that promote healthy decisions, problem solving skills and self esteem building.

Cost: No Cost for Participants

Camp Kennedy

For children ages 6-10.

Camp Kennedy is a summer program for children, ages 6-10, who are at risk for or are affected by substance abuse. Camp Kennedy focuses on violence/bullying prevention, Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug issues, socialization and fun.

Cost: No Cost for Participants

Peer Prevention

PANDA² Sr.

PANDA² Jr.

For 10-12th Grades. For 7-8th Grades.

PANDA² is a year-round program that includes school based education groups, drug-free clubs and activities, overnight lock-ins, presentations and speakers. The culmination of these year-round activities are two camp retreats; 1) a 4 day retreat for students in grades 10-12, and the 2) a 3 day retreat for students in grades 7-8.

Cost: PANDA² Jr. - \$95 per student/PANDA² Sr. - \$125 per student

PANDA Power Performers

For Grades 10-12.

Students are selected to participate in this "Social Issues" dramas such as "Turnaround," which illustrates the dangers and consequences of teenage involvement with Alcohol and Other Drugs. Participants develop these presentations in order to perform them at schools and events throughout the community.

For the Professional

BSAP (Basic Student Assistance Program)

For Adults.

This intense four-day training event is designed to provide knowledge, experience and skills which will be helpful in the development of comprehensive, evidence-based Student Assistance Programming. The purpose of this training is to assist school/community teams to assist students to remove barriers to academic achievement.

Cost: \$250 per person

Support Group Facilitator Training

For Adults.

This insightful three (3) day interactive workshop will motivate and teach participants the fine art of support group facilitation. This will enable the participant to provide structured support to address a variety of student issues.

Cost: \$200 per person

Second Step Facilitator Training

For Adults.

This customized training prepares school staff for implementing the *Second Step* violence prevention program. Participants will receive experience and practice with the curricula; learn how to effectively teach the program; and discuss implementation strategies. *Second Step* is a US Department of Education Exemplary Program.

Cost: \$65/person (10 person minimum)
